Arrows/Moving Around in a File

Here is a summary of the various key commands available for moving around in a file:

Up-arrow

move the cursor up one line

Down-arrow

move the cursor down one line

Shift-up-arrow

move the text up by 20 lines

Shift-down-arrow

`page' the text down by 20 lines (assuming a standard font size; see the section on 'fonts' for details).

Ctrl-down-arrow

move the text up a line at a time without altering the position of the cursor.

Ctrl-up-arrow

move the text down a line at a time without altering the position of the cursor.

<Home>

position the cursor at the first character of the file

Shift-<Home>

move the cursor to the end of the file

Ctrl-<Home>

moves the cursor to the top left hand corner of the screen

Shift-Ctrl-<Home>

moves the cursor to the bottom left corner of the screen.

Ctrl-W

move one word forward.

Ctrl-Q

move one word back.

Ctrl-X

delete a word forward.

Ctrl-Z

delete a word backward.

...pressing the Alt key and the Left arrow key in all Internet browsers takes you back one page. If you've gone back, pressing Alt and the Right arrow goes forward a page. ... Ctrl and press the Left arrow or Right arrow keys, it moves the cursor one word at a time instead of one character.

Move from one cell to another cell in a spreadsheet.
Use the right and left arrow keys to move between
columns and up and down arrow keys to move
between rows.

Select text. For example, hold down the Shift and press the arrow key in the direction you want to highlight text.

Move the mouse pointer using the keyboard instead of the mouse.
